Installation of Working Deck & Overhead

Protection Deck in Lift Shaft

The team at Sugar Dock have been trialling and developing a way that incorporates the cantilever scaffold into their working deck installation with benefits such as; all gravitational high risk works are done behind handrails with harnesses being worn as a secondary form of protection. Time saving as the cantilever scaffold deck had to be installed prior to the fixed working deck and then dismantled when working deck was complete. Non-Destructive Digging

The team at CNBP have been using a non destructive, hydro, vacuum excavation. It breaks up ground using high pressure water and vacuum it straight into spoil tank, with no chance of any cross contamination of material or damage to existing underground services. Flash Forward:

Work Pending

- We are developing a Crane Management and Fitness For Work Plans that will eventually be incorporated into the PDP process. We are using the best pieces from a number of plans that have been developed at site level that have had issues in these area's to manage.
- Since the GMR/Means and methods have been introduced the projects and the region focused on the Physical Means and Methods and updated them into Rev 2.1. We are now going to focus on the PPD GMR's/Means and method in a similar approach by undertaking similar Black and White Audits.
- Following a number of incident in relation to Formwork and Falsework the existing Pre-pour Checklist has been reviewed and a new Pre-pour Formwork Certificate Template.
- The NSW Crane Group have been trialling camera's on cranes jibs and loading bay's as a drivers aid when blind lifts are necessary.
- To come into line with Global requirement Quarterly EHS Audit have been loaded into Webcare on a trial basis. Out of the trial there has been a number of areas identified that can be improved and the Australian Region has submitted these to Global business for consideration.

NGER's Update

The new Bovis Lend Lease Compliance Guide to Mandatory Environmental & National Greenhouse and Energy Reporting System (NGERS) has been released and is available on the Blue Book. A series of "FACE to FACE" and a online "LIVE MEETING" information briefing is currently being rolled out to all RBU's to enable correct data capture. A key change is that the INSIGHT Environment database will now replace the EMA & the SMA reporting requirement in WebCare. The first proposed reporting month for data to be entered into INSIGHT Environment is January 2010 which must be entered by all projects by the 28th February 2010. A big Thank you to Darryl Stuckey (LLd) and Sheree Bailey (ICT) for their assistance in the roll out of the training.
